Land Use Applications:

Puyallup Street Partial Vacation:

The Town received a petition to vacate the eleven feet abutting 211 Puyallup Street. The street vacation process is required to have a public hearing, as opposed to a public meeting. (RCW 35.79.020, and SMC 12.08.070) There are strict procedural requirements and standards for the Council to consider in making its decision. The process is also considered quasi-judicial so the Mayor and Council should avoid contact or discussions (ex parte contact) on this matter outside of the public hearing. The Town Council set a public hearing for September 6, 2022, to hear the vacation request.

Building Inspection and Code Compliance:

The Building Inspector/Code Compliance Officer focused on inspecting construction activity, continued review of an alleyway access dispute, and followed up on other outstanding code compliance issues.

Notice of Public Nuisance:

A Declaration of Public Nuisance and Order to Abate was sent to the owners/beneficiaries of and posted on the property at 2746 Cambridge Drive. The Notice provides the owners until September 23, 2022, to abate the identified nuisance or the Town may take the abatement action and lien the property accordingly.

Public Safety:

Our third month of the Steilacoom Summer Slowdown has concluded. Over 270 traffic stops were performed by your officers, and our area of emphasis was Chambers Creek Road and Lafayette Street. For September, in conjunction with school beginning, officers will shift emphasis to our school zones.

Public Works:

Building Energy Efficiency/Replacement Project:

The lighting contractor is scheduled to commence work on September 12, 2022.

Streets and Storm:

Crew Emphasis:

The crew concentrated on painting crosswalks and stop bars along with restriping the Public Works facility parking lot; picked up garbage dumped along Chambers Creek Road; performed inspections on the Worthington Street extension off Galloway Street; assisted the Parks crew with hedge trimming on Roe Street; and performed other maintenance activities.

Urban Forestry Management:

Staff received two applications for review under the Urban Forestry Management ordinance. One is for removal of a large coniferous tree in an undeveloped alley northeast of Nisqually and Main Street. The

second is for topping or removal of two evergreen trees east of Chambers Creek Road near 88 Tatoosh Place. Staff along with an arborist will be reviewing these applications and the corresponding trees and processing the requests in accordance with the Urban Forestry Management provisions.

Electrical:

Crew Emphasis:

The crew responded to an unplanned power outage Tuesday evening in the 600 block of Shannon Street caused by faulty wire; met with a contractor concerning power requirements for a new home in the 1900 block of Rainier Street; disconnected power for a panel change in the 800 block of 1st Street; repaired primary wire on Shannon Street; performed vault maintenance on 3rd Street; installed a fused elbow in the vault on 3rd Street; and performed other maintenance activities.

Water/Sewer:

Crew Emphasis:

The crew continued fire hydrant maintenance; assisted the Electric crew with the unplanned power outage on Shannon Street; washed and cleaned lift station wet wells; and performed other maintenance activities.

Parks, Buildings and Grounds:

Crew Emphasis:

The crew mowed, trimmed, and maintained various parks and facilities as the weather allowed; supported the Farmers' Market and Summer Concert series; adjusted irrigation systems as needed; trimmed the hedge along Roe Street at the Public Works facility; and performed other maintenance activities.

What's Happening with Your Libraries:

Fort Steilacoom to present “The Many Wives of General August V. Kautz: Colonization in the Pacific Northwest, 1853-1895”

Fort Steilacoom Museum in Lakewood will host a talk 2 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 10, about the three wives of the man who supervised construction of the first official U.S. Army fort in Puget Sound. Four of these buildings still stand in Lakewood, some of the oldest surviving structures in Washington. Portland-based public historian Nicole Kindle will speak on the title of a paper she prepared for Portland State University, “The Many Wives of General August V. Kautz: Colonization in the Pacific Northwest, 1853-1895.”

The talk will include information about the challenges of researching and writing the history of women who left few, if any, written records. Kautz met his first wife, Kitty, a member of the Nisqually Tribe, when he was serving in what is now Lakewood. The tribe today includes many dozen members who are descended from Augustus and Kitty. In 1865, Kautz married Charlotte Tod, who died three years later of typhoid fever. He married Fannie Markbreit from 1872 until his death in 1895.

Kindle first learned about Kautz when she was a graduate student with the PSU history department and working as a research assistant on a joint project through PSU and the National Park Service at Fort Vancouver, which had close ties to Fort Steilacoom to the north. She graduated with a Master’s in history in 2019. She is currently an administrator at PSU.

Kautz was a lieutenant when he supervised the construction of the fort, the first official U.S. presence in Puget Sound, in 1857 and 1858. Four of those buildings survive today and form the museum in Lakewood located near the entrance to Western State Hospital and across the street from the city park that bears Fort Steilacoom’s name. The Historic Fort Steilacoom Association acknowledges the complex history of the Fort and its role in the colonization of the area. The association is actively working to incorporate the diverse perspectives and experiences of all individuals and communities who interacted with the Fort.
